Anthropologists

An anthropologist is a person engaged in the study of aspects of humans within past and present societies. Social anthropology, cultural anthropology and philosophical anthropology, etc. are a few branches to mention.

Eligibility to become an Anthropologist: One can be from the <u>Science stream</u> with Physics, Chemistry, and Biology as main subjects for a B.Sc. degree in Anthropology or from the <u>Arts stream</u> to get a B.An in Anthropology for an undergraduate degree.

> Step 1: Academic Eligibility

Complete 10+2 with a minimum aggregate of 50 percent of marks or equivalent to it from a recognized board.

> Step 2: Admission to college

While there are many colleges offering a course in Anthropology based on the 12th standard grades, there are certain entrance exams(listed below) that can be opted to get into the desired colleges.

> Step 3: Bachelor's programme

The admission to Bachelor's programme is offered by various universities under several courses across the country. B.Sc. (Bachelor of Science) in Archaeology, Anthropology, Museology. BA (Bachelor of Arts) in Sociology, Archival Studies and Manuscriptology to name a few.

- → Option 1: After completion of a Bachelor's degree programme, the candidates can further opt for a master's degree programme without any gap in the academic year. After completion of a master's degree programme in the related specialization, they can start working in the industry in an entry-level role.
- → Option 2: After completion of a Bachelor's degree programme, the candidates can start working in the industry in an entry-level role. After gaining experience of one or two years working in the industry, he or she can further opt for a master's degree programme.
- ➤ **Step 4**: Master's degree

Master's degree, if opted, can be pursued in the same research field as the Bachelor's.

> Step 5: Doctoral Programs

To pursue a career in academics or teach the related subjects in colleges, one needs to pursue M.Phil. after masters in the related subject. A candidate who I wish to work with international development agencies. It is required to have a Ph.D. in the subject.
